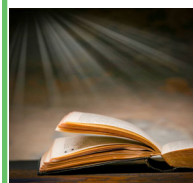

From the Pastor's Desk



My dear parishioners,

In the Gospel of this Sunday, we hear about the ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ in the region of Galilee.

The Lord Jesus went to visit the house of Simon Peter and Andrew, accompanied by other disciples such as James and John. In the house of Simon, his mother-in-law was sick with fever and laid down in bed. This was brought to the attention of the Lord Jesus. The Lord Jesus "approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up" (Mark 1:31a).

Simon's mother-in-law was healed and even proceeded to wait on the Lord and his disciples. That was not the only miracle of the day, because many other people came to Jesus, bringing those who were ill or possessed by evil spirits, and all were healed of their illnesses and set free by the Lord. Just like the Lord Jesus grasped the hand of Simon's mother-in-law and helped her up, in the same way the Lord grasps our hands and helps us up when we feel down because of the weight of life's challenges.

There are moments when we feel like life has knocked us down because of an illness, the frailty of old age, the health issues of a loved one or even the loss of those who are dear to us. It is at those moments that we should turn to the Lord Jesus and ask for the help of his grace, so that we may be strengthened in our faith and be raised up. The power of God is at work in us through the ministry of the Church and through the sacraments. God reaches out to us to grasp us by the hand and to help us up.

That is even what we express when we pray for the sick in the beautiful sacrament of the anointing of the sick. The priest anoints the sick person with these words: "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin, save you and raise you up."

Indeed, the Lord has come to free us from sin and evil, just as he freed those who were possessed by evil spirits. He has come to raise us up by the grace of the Holy Spirit. Let us open our hearts and receive that grace that saves the whole world. *God bless you always.*

Lenten Regulations

The penitential and grace-filled **Lenten Season begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14, 2024**. It is a time of hope-filled renewal as the Church journeys towards Easter. In order to assist the faithful of the Diocese of Brooklyn, our Bishop, the Most Reverend Robert Brennan, wishes to draw attention to the following:

Abstinence:

All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting:

All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day.

Easter Duty:

After they have been fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, **all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year**. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time.

By special permission, in the USA, the period for fulfilling this precept is extended to include the period from the 1st Sunday of Lent (Feb. 18, 2024) until Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

Also to be noted:

The "Alleluia" is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil. Musical instruments are to be used during Lent and the Paschal Triduum only to give necessary support to the singing. **The Church should not be decorated with flowers during Lent.**

Funeral Masses are not permitted during the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday).

The obligation to observe, as a whole or substantially, the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious one. Days of penance are not merely individual exercises but rather ones observed by the whole Church as the Body of Christ. The faithful are urged to celebrate the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penances frequently during Lent as well as reading the Word of God, praying the Stations of the Cross, praying before the Blessed Sacrament and performing acts of charity especially to the poor. May this time of Lent unite us all more closely to the Lord in His death and His Resurrection!

5^e dimanche du Temps Ordinaire

Chers frères et sœurs,

L'évangile de ce Dimanche nous parle du ministère de notre Seigneur Jésus Christ dans la région de Galilée. Le Seigneur Jésus est allé rendre visite à Simon et son frère André, et il se fait accompagner des autres disciples comme Jacques et Jean.

La belle-mère de Simon était malade avec de la fièvre et elle était couchée au lit. On parla d'elle au Seigneur. Le Seigneur Jésus "s'approcha, la saisit par la main et la fit lever" (Marc 1:31a). La belle-mère de Simon était guérie et elle commençait même à servir le Seigneur et ses disciples. Ceci n'était pas le seul miracle de la journée, parce que beaucoup d'autres personnes sont venues vers Jésus, amenant ceux qui étaient malades ou possédés par des démons, et tous étaient guéris de leurs maladies et délivrés de leur possession démoniaque par le Seigneur.

Tout comme le Seigneur Jésus avait saisi par la main la belle-mère de Simon et la fit lever, de la même manière le Seigneur nous tient par la main et nous aide à nous lever quand nous nous sentons abattus par le poids des défis de la vie. Il y a des moments où nous nous sentons renverser par la vie, peut-être à cause d'une maladie, le poids de la vieillesse, le problème de santé d'un proche ou même la perte d'un être cher. C'est pendant ces moments que nous devons nous tourner vers le Seigneur Jésus et demander l'aide de sa grâce, pour que nous soyons affermis dans notre foi et que nous soyons relevés.

Le pouvoir de Dieu est à l'œuvre dans nos vies par le ministère de l'Eglise et par les sacrements. Dieu s'approche de nous pour nous tenir par la main et nous faire lever. C'est même ce que nous exprimons quand nous prions pour les malades dans le beau sacrement de l'onction des malades. Le prêtre fait l'onction avec ces mots: "Par cette onction sainte, que le Seigneur, en sa grande bonté, vous reconforte par la grâce de l'Esprit Saint. Ainsi, vous ayant libéré de tous péchés, qu'il vous sauve et vous relève."

En effet, le Seigneur est venu pour nous libérer de l'emprise du péché et du mal, comme il avait délivré ceux qui étaient possédés par les esprits mauvais. Il est venu nous relever par la grâce de l'Esprit Saint. Ouvrons nos cœurs pour recevoir cette grâce qui sauve le monde entier. *Que Dieu vous bénisse.*

Règlement du Carême

Le Carême, période de pénitence et de grâce, commence avec le mercredi des Cendres, le 14 février 2024. C'est un temps de renouveau rempli d'espoir, alors que l'Église se dirige vers Pâques. Afin d'aider les fidèles du diocèse de Brooklyn, notre évêque, Mgr Robert Brennan, souhaite attirer l'attention sur les points suivants :

Abstinence :

Tous les fidèles ayant atteint l'âge de 14 ans sont tenus de s'abstenir de viande le mercredi des Cendres et tous les vendredis du Carême.

Jeûne :

Tous les fidèles âgés de 18 à 59 ans inclus sont tenus de jeûner le mercredi des Cendres et le Vendredi saint. Le jeûne consiste à se limiter à un seul repas complet et à éviter de manger entre les repas. Il est possible de se restaurer légèrement à deux autres occasions au cours de la journée.

Devoir de Pâques :

Après avoir été pleinement initiés à la très sainte Eucharistie, tous les fidèles sont tenus de communier au moins une fois par an. Ce précepte doit être accompli pendant le temps paschal, à moins que, pour une bonne raison, il ne soit accompli à un autre moment.

Par permission spéciale, aux États-Unis, la période d'accomplissement de ce précepte est étendue pour inclure la période allant du 1er dimanche de Carême (18 Fév. 2024) à la Pentecôte (19 Mai 2024).

A noter également :

L'"**Alléluia**" n'est pas chanté ou dit du début du carême jusqu'à la veillée pascale. Les instruments de musique ne doivent être utilisés pendant le Carême et le Triduum paschal que pour apporter le soutien nécessaire au chant. **L'église ne doit pas être décorée de fleurs pendant le carême.**

Les messes de funérailles ne sont pas autorisées pendant le Triduum paschal (**jeudi saint, vendredi saint et samedi saint**).

L'obligation d'observer, dans l'ensemble ou en grande partie, les jours de pénitence spécifiés par l'Église est une obligation sérieuse. Les jours de pénitence ne sont pas de simples exercices individuels, mais sont observés par toute l'Église en tant que Corps du Christ. Les fidèles sont invités à célébrer fréquemment les sacrements de l'Eucharistie et de la Pénitence pendant le Carême, ainsi qu'à lire la Parole de Dieu, à faire le Chemin de Croix, à prier devant le Saint Sacrement et à accomplir des actes de charité, en particulier envers les pauvres. Puisse ce temps de carême nous unir plus étroitement au Seigneur dans sa mort et sa résurrection !
