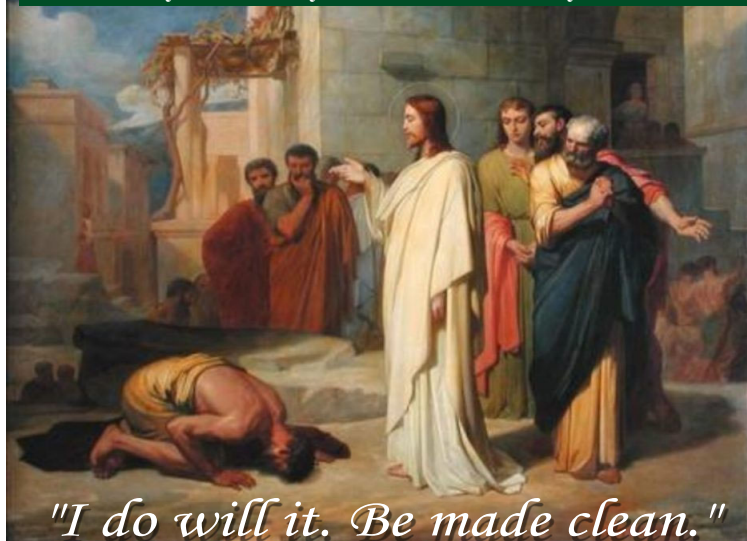

From the Pastor's Desk



The Gospel of this sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time speaks to us about the encounter between the Lord Jesus and the man suffering from leprosy.

The law of Moses, as presented in the first reading, prohibited anyone suffering from leprosy to be in contact with the rest of the society. The book of Leviticus says: *"The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!' As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp"* (Leviticus 13:45-46).

Clearly, the instructions that God gave to Moses and his brother Aaron were to isolate those who were suffering from leprosy so that they may not interact with anybody in the community, because they were declared unclean. If they had to travel a road with the risk of meeting anyone along the way, they had to shout "unclean, unclean", to alert anyone coming their way and to avoid any encounter with others.

But we see that the man suffering from leprosy in the Gospel does not follow these instructions. Instead, he purposely meets the Lord Jesus and asks him to make him clean. He approaches the Lord Jesus, kneels before him and begs him by saying: *"If you wish, you can make me clean"* (Mark 1:40). It means that he is asking for healing from his leprosy so that he may be restored into the community.

The Lord Jesus does not see someone "unclean" in front of him, and touches him, going against the prescription of Moses. The Lord touches him because he is a human being endowed with dignity and says to him: *"I do will it. Be made clean"* (Mark 1:41).

We may not suffer from leprosy like the man in the Gospel, but sin cuts us off from God and from one another; sin isolates us and disfigures us. We need to approach the Lord Jesus and ask him to make us clean and to restore us to the dignity of the children of God. We need the Lord Jesus to cleanse us of the impurity of sin, and restore our relationship with God, with one another and with the community.

The Lord does not turn anyone away. In his love and mercy, he says to each and everyone of us, *"I do will it. Be made clean."* *God bless you always.*

Lenten Regulations

The penitential and grace-filled **Lenten Season begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14, 2024**. It is a time of hope-filled renewal as the Church journeys towards Easter. In order to assist the faithful of the Diocese of Brooklyn, our Bishop, the Most Reverend Robert Brennan, wishes to draw attention to the following:

Abstinence:

All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting:

All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day.

Easter Duty:

After they have been fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, **all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year**. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time.

By special permission, in the USA, the period for fulfilling this precept is extended to include the period from the 1st Sunday of Lent (March 2, 2022) until Pentecost (June 5, 2022).

Also to be noted:

The "Alleluia" is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil. Musical instruments are to be used during Lent and the Paschal Triduum only to give necessary support to the singing. The Church should not be decorated with flowers during Lent.

Funeral Masses are not permitted during the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday).

The obligation to observe, as a whole or substantially, the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious one. Days of penance are not merely individual exercises but rather ones observed by the whole Church as the Body of Christ. The faithful are urged to celebrate the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penance frequently during Lent as well as reading the Word of God, praying the Stations of the Cross, praying before the Blessed Sacrament and performing acts of charity especially to the poor. May this time of Lent unite us all more closely to the Lord in His death and His Resurrection!

6è dimanche du Temps Ordinaire

L'Évangile de ce sixième dimanche du Temps Ordinaire nous parle de la rencontre entre le Seigneur Jésus et un homme souffrant de la lèpre.

La loi de Moïse, telle que présentée dans la première lecture, interdisait à toute personne atteinte de la lèpre d'être en contact avec le reste de la société. Le livre du Lévitique dit : « *Le lépreux atteint d'une tache portera des vêtements déchirés et les cheveux en désordre, il se couvrira le haut du visage jusqu'aux lèvres, et il criera: "Impur ! Impur !" Tant qu'il gardera cette tache, il sera vraiment impur. C'est pourquoi il habitera à l'écart, son habitation sera hors du camp* » (Lévitique 13 :45-46).

De toute évidence, les instructions que Dieu a données à Moïse et à son frère Aaron étaient d'isoler ceux qui souffraient de la lèpre afin qu'ils ne puissent pas interagir avec les autres membres de la communauté, car ils étaient déclarés impurs. S'ils devaient parcourir une route avec le risque de croiser quelqu'un sur le chemin, ils devaient crier « *impur, impur* », pour alerter quiconque approchait et éviter toute rencontre avec autrui.

Mais on voit que l'homme souffrant de la lèpre dans l'Évangile ne suit pas ces instructions. Au contraire, il rencontre délibérément le Seigneur Jésus et lui demande de le purifier. Il s'approche du Seigneur Jésus, s'agenouille devant lui et le supplie en disant : « *Si tu le veux, tu peux me purifier* » (Marc 1:40). Cela signifie qu'il demande la guérison de sa lèpre afin de pouvoir réintégrer la communauté.

Le Seigneur Jésus ne voit pas quelqu'un « *impur* » devant lui et le touche, allant à l'encontre de ce que Moïse avait prescrit. Le Seigneur le touche parce qu'il est un être humain doté de dignité et lui dit : « *Je le veux, sois purifié* » (Marc 1:41).

Nous ne souffrons peut-être pas de la lèpre comme l'homme de l'Évangile, mais le péché nous sépare de Dieu et nous sépare les uns des autres ; le péché nous isole et nous défigure. Nous devons nous approcher du Seigneur Jésus et lui demander de nous purifier et de nous restaurer à la dignité des enfants de Dieu.

Nous avons besoin du Seigneur Jésus pour nous purifier de l'impureté du péché et restaurer notre relation avec Dieu, avec les autres et avec la communauté. Le Seigneur ne repousse personne. Dans son amour et sa miséricorde, il dit à chacun de nous, « *Je le veux, sois purifié.* » *Que Dieu vous bénisse.*

Règlement du Carême

Le Carême, période de pénitence et de grâce, commence avec le mercredi des Cendres, le 14 février 2024. C'est un temps de renouveau rempli d'espoir, alors que l'Église se dirige vers Pâques. Afin d'aider les fidèles du diocèse de Brooklyn, notre évêque, Mgr Robert Brennan, souhaite attirer l'attention sur les points suivants :

Abstinence :

Tous les fidèles ayant atteint l'âge de 14 ans sont tenus de s'abstenir de viande le mercredi des Cendres et tous les vendredis du Carême.

Jeûne :

Tous les fidèles âgés de 18 à 59 ans inclus sont tenus de jeûner le mercredi des Cendres et le Vendredi saint. Le jeûne consiste à se limiter à un seul repas complet et à éviter de manger entre les repas. Il est possible de se restaurer légèrement à deux autres occasions au cours de la journée.

Devoir de Pâques :

Après avoir été pleinement initiés à la très sainte Eucharistie, tous les fidèles sont tenus de communier au moins une fois par an. Ce précepte doit être accompli pendant le temps paschal, à moins que, pour une bonne raison, il ne soit accompli à un autre moment.

Par permission spéciale, aux États-Unis, la période d'accomplissement de ce précepte est étendue pour inclure la période allant du 1er dimanche de Carême (18 Fév. 2024) à la Pentecôte (19 Mai 2024).

A noter également :

L'"**Alléluia**" n'est pas chanté ou dit du début du carême jusqu'à la veillée pascale. Les instruments de musique ne doivent être utilisés pendant le Carême et le Triduum pascal que pour apporter le soutien nécessaire au chant. **L'église ne doit pas être décorée de fleurs pendant le carême.**

Les messes de funérailles ne sont pas autorisées pendant le Triduum pascal (**jeudi saint, vendredi saint et samedi saint**).

L'obligation d'observer, dans l'ensemble ou en grande partie, les jours de pénitence spécifiés par l'Église est une obligation sérieuse. Les jours de pénitence ne sont pas de simples exercices individuels, mais sont observés par toute l'Église en tant que Corps du Christ. Les fidèles sont invités à célébrer fréquemment les sacrements de l'Eucharistie et de la Pénitence pendant le Carême, ainsi qu'à lire la Parole de Dieu, à faire le Chemin de Croix, à prier devant le Saint Sacrement et à accomplir des actes de charité, en particulier envers les pauvres. Puisse ce temps de carême nous unir plus étroitement au Seigneur dans sa mort et sa résurrection !
