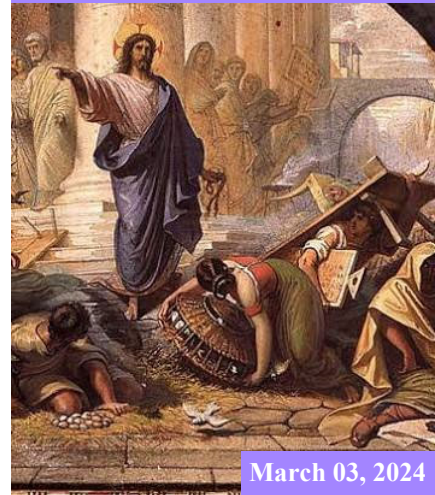

## From the Pastor's Desk



My dear parishioners,

The Gospel of this Sunday speaks about the cleansing of the Temple (John 2:13-25). The Lord Jesus went to Jerusalem in preparation of the Passover.

Jesus and his parents used to go on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to pray in the Temple and to offer sacrifices. He was familiar with the Temple, which was the symbol of God's presence in the midst of His people. When he was twelve years old, the Lord Jesus was left behind by his parents during one of those pilgrimages to Jerusalem. After the search, his parents found him in the Temple and expressed their worries to the child Jesus, who responded: *"Why are you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"* (Luke 2:49).

Already at a younger age, Jesus knew the importance of the Temple and the central role it played in the lives of people. He called the Temple *"my father's house."* It means that the Temple was the sacred place of encounter and communion with God. This can explain how shocked the Lord Jesus was when he saw people desecrating a holy place, by turning the Temple of God into a marketplace. The Lord rebuked them and chased them out by saying, *"Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace"* (John 2:16).

It was not out of the ordinary to see people who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as money changers around the Temple. It was convenient for pilgrims, especially those who came from the diaspora to offer sacrifices to the Temple. They could not travel long distances with animals for the sacrifice. It was convenient for them to buy animals at the site for the offering. And if they came from a foreign country with foreign currency, they could use money changers to get the local currency for the transaction. But somehow the business moved in the Temple area, and the Lord made the point that a sacred space should be respected and venerated.

At the same time, the Lord took the opportunity to announce the mystery of his passion, death and resurrection. *"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."* The Jews said, *"This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?"* But he was speaking about the temple of his body" (John 2:19-21).

May this Lenten season help us to enter deeply into the mystery of our salvation, the paschal mystery, namely the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## Lenten Regulations

The penitential and grace-filled **Lenten Season** began on **Ash Wednesday on February 14, 2024**. It is a time of hope-filled renewal as the Church journeys towards Easter. In order to assist the faithful of the Diocese of Brooklyn, our Bishop, the Most Reverend Robert Brennan, wishes to draw attention to the following:

### **Abstinence:**

**All the faithful who have reached 14 years** of age are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

### **Fasting:**

**All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59** inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day.

### **Easter Duty:**

After they have been fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, **all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year**. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time.

By special permission, in the USA, the period for fulfilling this precept is extended to include the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent (February 18 2024) until Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

### **Also to be noted:**

**The "Alleluia" is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil.** Musical instruments are to be used during Lent and the Paschal Triduum only to give necessary support to the singing. **The Church should not be decorated with flowers during Lent.**

**Funeral Masses are not permitted during the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday).**

The obligation to observe, as a whole or substantially, the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious one. Days of penance are not merely individual exercises but rather ones observed by the whole Church as the Body of Christ. The faithful are urged to celebrate the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penances frequently during Lent as well as reading the Word of God, praying the Stations of the Cross, praying before the Blessed Sacrament and performing acts of charity especially to the poor. May this time of Lent unite us all more closely to the Lord in His death and His Resurrection!

## 3e Dimanche de Carême

*Chers frères et sœurs,*

L'Évangile de ce dimanche parle de la purification du Temple (Jean 2 : 13-25). Le Seigneur Jésus est allé à Jérusalem pour préparer la Pâque.

Jésus et ses parents allaient souvent en pèlerinage à Jérusalem pour prier au Temple et offrir des sacrifices. Il connaissait le Temple qui était le symbole de la présence de Dieu au milieu de son peuple. À l'âge de douze ans, le Seigneur Jésus était perdu à Jérusalem lors d'un de ces pèlerinages, au point que ses parents ne le voyaient plus. Après la recherche, ses parents l'avaient retrouvé dans le Temple et avaient exprimé leurs inquiétudes à l'enfant Jésus, qui avait répondu: « *Comment se fait-il que vous m'avez cherché ? Ne saviez-vous pas qu'il me faut être chez mon Père ?* » (Luc 2:49). Dès son plus jeune âge, Jésus connaissait l'importance du Temple et le rôle central qu'il jouait dans la vie des gens. Il appelait le Temple « la maison de mon père ». Cela signifie que le Temple était le lieu sacré de rencontre et de communion avec Dieu. Cela peut expliquer à quel point le Seigneur Jésus a été choqué lorsqu'il a vu des gens profaner un lieu saint en transformant le Temple de Dieu en marché. Le Seigneur les réprimanda et les chassa en disant : « *Enlevez cela d'ici. Cessez de faire de la maison de mon Père une maison de commerce* » (Jean 2 : 16).

Il n'était pas inhabituel de voir des gens vendre des bœufs, des moutons et des colombes, ainsi que des changeurs de monnaie autour du Temple. Cela convenait aux pèlerins, notamment à ceux venus de la diaspora, pour offrir des sacrifices au Temple. Ils ne pouvaient pas parcourir de longues distances avec des animaux pour le sacrifice. C'était pratique pour eux d'acheter des animaux sur place pour l'offrande. Et s'ils venaient d'un pays étranger avec des devises étrangères, ils pouvaient utiliser des changeurs de monnaie pour obtenir la monnaie locale nécessaire à la transaction. Mais d'une manière ou d'une autre, les affaires se sont déplacées dans la zone du Temple, et le Seigneur a souligné qu'un espace sacré devait être respecté et vénéré.

En même temps, le Seigneur a profité de l'occasion pour annoncer le mystère de sa passion, de sa mort et de sa résurrection. « *Détruisez ce sanctuaire, et en trois jours je le relèverai.* » *Les Juifs lui répliquèrent : « Il a fallu quarante-six ans pour bâtir ce sanctuaire, et toi, en trois jours tu le relèverais ! » Mais lui parlait du sanctuaire de son corps* » (Jean 2 : 19-21).

Que ce temps de Carême nous aide à entrer en profondeur dans le mystère de notre salut, le mystère pascal, à savoir la passion, la mort et la résurrection de notre Seigneur Jésus-Christ. Que Dieu vous bénisse.

## Règlement du Carême

Le Carême, période de pénitence et de grâce, commence avec le mercredi des Cendres, le 14 février 2024. C'est un temps de renouveau rempli d'espoir, alors que l'Église se dirige vers Pâques. Afin d'aider les fidèles du diocèse de Brooklyn, notre évêque, Mgr Robert Brennan, souhaite attirer l'attention sur les points suivants :

### Abstinence :

Tous les fidèles ayant atteint l'âge de 14 ans sont tenus de s'abstenir de viande le mercredi des Cendres et tous les vendredis du Carême.

### Jeûne :

Tous les fidèles âgés de 18 à 59 ans inclus sont tenus de jeûner le mercredi des Cendres et le Vendredi saint. Le jeûne consiste à se limiter à un seul repas complet et à éviter de manger entre les repas. Il est possible de se restaurer légèrement à deux autres occasions au cours de la journée.

### Devoir de Pâques :

Après avoir été pleinement initiés à la très sainte Eucharistie, tous les fidèles sont tenus de communier au moins une fois par an. Ce précepte doit être accompli pendant le temps paschal, à moins que, pour une bonne raison, il ne soit accompli à un autre moment.

Par permission spéciale, aux États-Unis, la période d'accomplissement de ce précepte est étendue pour inclure la période allant du 1er dimanche de Carême (18 Fév. 2024) à la Pentecôte (19 Mai 2024).

### A noter également :

L'"**Alléluia**" n'est pas chanté ou dit du début du carême jusqu'à la veillée pascale. Les instruments de musique ne doivent être utilisés pendant le Carême et le Triduum pascal que pour apporter le soutien nécessaire au chant. **L'église ne doit pas être décorée de fleurs pendant le carême.**

**Les messes de funérailles ne sont pas autorisées** pendant le Triduum pascal (**jeudi saint, vendredi saint et samedi saint**).

L'obligation d'observer, dans l'ensemble ou en grande partie, les jours de pénitence spécifiés par l'Église est une obligation sérieuse. Les jours de pénitence ne sont pas de simples exercices individuels, mais sont observés par toute l'Église en tant que Corps du Christ. Les fidèles sont invités à célébrer fréquemment les sacrements de l'Eucharistie et de la Pénitence pendant le Carême, ainsi qu'à lire la Parole de Dieu, à faire le Chemin de Croix, à prier devant le Saint Sacrement et à accomplir des actes de charité, en particulier envers les pauvres. Puisse ce temps de carême nous unir plus étroitement au Seigneur dans sa mort et sa résurrection !
